My dear parishioners,

We have arrived at the Fourth Sunday of Advent and the celebration of the Lord's Day. Next Sunday we will celebrate the feast of our salvation, the Nativity of our God and Savior, Jesus Christ. Of the four Evangelists only Luke and Matthew tell the story of the birth of the Savior. In today's Gospel we hear Saint Matthew's version of this event and of the prominent role Saint Joseph plays within it. Joseph is the quiet man, the obedient man who is faith-filled and open to the bidding of God. Like his spouse, the Blessed Virgin Mary, Joseph places his life in God's hands even though he is unsure of what will be. Saint Joseph is a loving husband who goes to great lengths to protect his wife and the child who will be born to them. He is the protector of this Holy Family, its guardian and strength. We are at the threshold of the feast which commemorates God's Gift-giving to us, the birth of our Savior. We are continually reminded in the Sacred Scriptures of the generosity of God and the blessings which He continually bestows upon us. In one verse of today's Responsorial Psalm we find the words, "He shall receive a blessing from the Lord, a reward from God his savior." This "he" is the servant of God, that is, all those who place their trust in the Lord. We, you and me, are hopefully in this group. As we seek to be in God's company so He blesses us for He is the "King of Glory."

This year Christmas falls on a Sunday and presents a situation where the regular Sunday offering could be overlooked by some, a concern of many pastors who need the regular weekly offering for parish expenses. Here in our parish I am always grateful for the manner in which our parishioners respond so generously with "special gifts" to the parish at Christmas and Easter. I share this because I want to reinforce and encourage your generosity to the Church in appreciation to God for sending us the very best gift, His Son Christ the Lord.

With next Sunday being the last Sunday of the year let me remind you that your financial gift to our Church is a charitable donation to a non-profit corporation which is beneficial to you in tax reporting. Your donation of cash, stocks or other financial instruments are greatly appreciated and can bring blessings to us for years to come. I say THANK YOU to all of you who support the Church with such love and generosity. I pray that the Lord will reward you for your fidelity in this life and in the life to come!

ADVENT – time of prayer and reflection...

- Our Gospel today focuses on the preparation made by Joseph for the first Christmas. It was a most difficult preparation for him.
- What gave Joseph the strength to endure all the trials his vocation brought him? It was obviously his life of prayer that gave him the strength to be obedient to God's call to him. He was a just man, a man of honor as our Gospel today tells us. He had to have been a man of deep faith to fulfill his high calling.
- Marriage and virginity are two signs of the love of God for us and we see both of these united in the first couple of the New Testament, Mary and Joseph. Joseph is a model of chastity. The chastity of Joseph and Mary is a challenge to our times when the sanctity of marriage and fidelity to one's spouse for life are no longer respected.

St. Joseph is Patron of the Church. He had to make preparations for the first Christmas, to submit to God's plan in faith. As we prepare for Christmas we can turn to Joseph asking his help so that we can prepare our hearts in faith to be worthy mangers to receive Jesus

Reflection:

Do not be afraid. What fears and anxieties keep me from living my call to be a missionary disciple? How can I help others live their calls without fear?

God is with us. How am I aware of God's presence in my daily life? How do I make God present to others?

He did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him. How do I discern God's plan for my life? What steps can I take to help me follow the Lord more closely?

that those who trust in your compassion
may find solace and relief in your coming.
Who live and reign with God the Father
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
