*This is the LORD'S DAY and the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. Both come to a conclusion on Sunday November 20th, which is only two weeks away.*

*This is an important week for all Americans as we exercise our right to vote in the elections, both national and local, on Tuesday. This year's presidential race has brought about considerable interest and its outcome will be greatly watched across this country. The issues, which each major candidate has a different stand, are of great concern for us as Catholic Christians. *Included within the Sunday bulletin was information published by the South Carolina Catholic Conference regarding the issues and the candidates for president. I believe that this is an excellent tool so that Catholics can be informed, in a concise way, of the stand taken by the candidates which will assist voters in their decision making when voting. I have taken the liberty of reproducing this information as an insert for today's bulletin so that you see what efforts are being taken to instruct the faithful in matters which have grave moral and religious concern.*

*PRAY for our country this week. May our nation choose the best candidate who will defend the great gift of life from conception to natural death. Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta said that a country which kills its children is a country without hope. Let us pray that we will choose the right one who will provide hope and opportunities for all people, not forgetting the most vulnerable among us.*
