My dear parishioners,

On this first day of the week, the Lord's Day, we observe the First Sunday of the Holy Season of Lent. We commence our Lenten journey by hearing the Gospel account of the Lord Jesus being tempted by the devil as he fasted and prayed in the desert following His baptism in the Jordan. This was the Lord's retreat which prepared Him to begin His public ministry for the salvation of the world.

This afternoon we will be sending off catechumens to the Rite of Election which will take place at Saint Philip the Apostle Church in Clifton. His Excellency, Bishop Arthur Serratelli will enroll their names in the Book of the Elect which will formally accept them for the sacraments of initiation at the Vigil during the Great and Holy Night of Easter, Saturday, April 15th. We have catechumens from both Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish and Saint Cecilia Parish which is a great blessing for Rockaway. During the Sundays of Lent we will have the opportunity to join with the catechumens and candidates for the various rites which will be performed over them as they make their way to Easter, the Lord's Passover.

As we journey with our brothers and sisters "for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter," we are reminded of the Lenten call to conversion and renewal. This week you will be receiving in the mail information regarding the INCREASED OFFERTORY PROGRAM which is being launched in our parish and throughout the parishes of the Diocese of Paterson. I ask that you take the time to read the brochure regarding our parish and the important points which are addressed. You will also find a COMMITMENT CARD which I ask that you bring with you to church next Sunday. Please review the card, fill it out, but before you do that, stop and say a prayer to the Holy Spirit asking for guidance as to what your offertory gift should be for the glory of God and the support of His Church. I will briefly speak about the commitment card at all Masses next Sunday so that everyone in the parish may be able to participate in this invitation to review our offerings. We do so mindful of the blessings which God has given us and acknowledge that everything belongs to God, for we are only the managers of His blessings.

Your faith and the love which you have for Christ and His Church always inspire me! I know that the renewal of our offertory commitment will assure that our parish will continue to excel in witnessing to the Gospel of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ.

### **BIBLE REFLECTION**

Mt 4, 1-11

1st Sunday of Lent

"...One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God..."

"...You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test..."

"...Jesus said to him, "Get away, Satan! It is written: The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve..."

#### **REFLECTION**

- Jesus was tempted. Temptation of the bread, temptation of prestige, temptation of power.

- Temptation never succeeded in deviating Jesus from his mission.

- The tempter or Satan is whatever makes us deviate from God's plan. Peter was Satan for Jesus (Mt 16,23). (Peter tried to take him away from the cross: "Lord, this will never happen!" (Mt 16,22). And he heard the reply, "Get behind me, Satan!" (Mk 8,33).

- Jesus defines his mission with these words, "The Son of man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life for the redemption of many!" (Mt 20,28; Mk 10,45).

**SOME QUESTIONS** – to help us meditate and pray.

1. What does the word temptation suggest to us today? How does it affect me in my daily life?

2. The tempter or Satan is he or she or that which takes me away from or makes me deviate from God's path. It may be that I have already been Satan for someone, just like Peter was for Jesus.

#### **PRAYER**

Lord Jesus in the desert you faced the ancient enemy of the human race and showed your power over him. By your grace, help us to face temptation without giving way to it. AMEN!

**Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence:** Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though it's made from animal fat. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are eighteen years of age but not yet fifty-nine are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted.

**LENTEN LUNCHES**—The Rockaway Ecumenical Clergy Association will once again sponsor a Lenten Luncheon for seniors every Friday during Lent, except Good Friday. The Lunch begins at 12 Noon in the Fellowship Hall of the First Presbyterian Church located on church Street. Following lunch a brief prayer service and reflection will be given by a designated clergy person from the Catholic and Protestant Congregations serving Rockaway.
