HOLY WEEK PENANCE SERVICE CORRECTION – A penance service will be held during Holy Week on Tuesday evening, April 11 at 7 o'clock. The service will take place in Saint Cecilia Church and is the final time when the sacrament will be celebrated for parishioners of both Saint Cecilia and Sacred Heart prior to Easter. Please note that the Holy Week schedule which was sent out with the Sunday offering envelopes lists Wednesday as the penance service, which is INCORRECT!

Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence:

Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though it's made from animal fat. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are eighteen years of age but not yet fifty-nine are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted.

My dear parishioners,

Today we mark the Third Sunday of Lent as we gather to celebrate the Lord's Day. The symbol of water takes a prominent place in the Scriptural texts which are presented to us for our reflection. In the Gospel the Samaritan Woman meets Christ the Savior at the well in Nablus where He offers her "water welling up to eternal life." As their dialogue continues she becomes amazed at what the Lord says and she sets out to share the news of what has been told her. Her testimony inspires others to meet the Lord Jesus and so they go forth to quench their spiritual thirst. In Church Tradition the Samaritan Woman is named PHOTIA, which means light. She is the evangelist who brings others to Christ by the power of her testimony. She had introduced her neighbors to Christ who now tell her, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Savior of the world."

Witnessing to our faith is a powerful evangelical tool. Speaking about faith to others at home and in the marketplace is what we are called to do. Today's secular culture tells us that this witness is acceptable in the privacy of one's home, but not in the marketplace. Not only is this a human rights violations but above all it is a violation of the Lord's command to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age." (Mat.28:19)

We have a variety of opportunities to be like Saint Photia and lead others to Christ. Our invitation to come along with us to Mass, Bible study, faith formation gatherings and more are the "Wells" where we can meet Christ and come to faith. From these places we go forth witnessing and inviting others to meet Christ the Lord.

Today we are selling tickets to really wonderful Catholic experience called REBOOT. This event will take place on Friday evening, April 21st at Saint Theresa School Auditorium in Succasunna running from 7 to 9:30. You will be inspired by the witness of evangelist Christ Stefanik and entertained by contemporary Christian music. This will be a wonderful evening of inspiration. Definitely this is something you do not want to miss and definitely this is something to which you should invite a friend, especially one who needs faith to be rebooted!

3RD SUNDAY OF LENT - JN 4:5-42

-Jesus meets with the Samaritan Woman-

"...“Come see a man who told me everything I have done. Could he possibly be the Christ?...”

REFLECTION

- Living water is not the only image or symbol Jesus uses to reveal who he is and the eternal life he came to bring us; he refers to himself as the bread of life, the light of the world, the good shepherd, the lamb of God, the vine of which we are the branches, the resurrection and the life, just to name a few of the other images Jesus uses. The important message we get from today's Gospel is that the more we engage with Jesus in reflection and prayer, even in spite of distractions, the more he seeks to lead us into a deeper relationship with himself and with the Father.

- Today's Gospel invites us to dream about the possibility of a world where opportunity and hope replace the bondage of fear and despair. God really does not want us to live a life of quiet desperation. Jesus has come to reveal the Father's love and the Spirit is ready to convince us of that fact.
